Subject:	Proposal for a REGULATION OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AND OF THE COUNCIL repealing Regulation (EU) No 524/2013 and amending Regulations (EU) 2017/2394 and (EU) 2018/1724 with regards to the discontinuation of the European ODR Platform - Political agreement

I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

1. On 17 October 2023, the <u>Commission</u> submitted to the Council and the European Parliament a proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council repealing Regulation (EU) No 524/2013 and amending Regulations (EU) 2017/2394 and (EU) 2018/1724 with regards to the discontinuation of the European ODR Platform¹.

- 2. The proposal forms part of the Commission's commitment to rationalise and simplify reporting requirements, with the aim to reduce such burdens by 25%, without undermining the related policy objectives, as stated in its Communication on 'Long-term competitiveness of the EU: looking beyond 2030'². It aims to repeal the ODR Regulation, thus discontinuing the ODR platform and removing the associated obligations.
- 3. The draft Directive is based on Article 114 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union (TFEU) (ordinary legislative procedure).
- 4. The <u>European Economic and Social Committee</u> delivered its opinion on 14 February 2024³.
- 5. The <u>European Parliament</u> adopted its first-reading position⁴ by taking over the Commission proposal at the plenary session on 13 March 2024 and forwarded its position to the Council.

II. WORK CONDUCTED IN THE COUNCIL PREPARATORY BODIES

- 6. On 28 November 2023, during the <u>Spanish Presidency</u>, the Commission presented the proposal and the accompanying impact assessment to the <u>Working Party on Consumer Protection and Information</u>, and a first exchange of views took place. The examination of the proposal began under the <u>Belgian Presidency</u> and continued under the <u>Hungarian Presidency</u> in parallel to the discussions on the proposal for a Directive of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Directive 2013/11/EU on alternative dispute resolution for consumer disputes⁵.
- 7. On 12 September 2024 the <u>Working Party on Consumer Protection and Information</u> concluded its examination of the Commission proposal, without making any amendments to the text.
